#### MEETING PRESSING NEEDS

- Life Skill Development
  - Some will live with our families host
  - Some will integrate into our churches hospitality, openness, family meals
  - A support team is needed to help them be resourced.
    i.e. budgeting, transportation, employment, parenting, cooking, cleaning, etc
- Faith Development
  - Some will need older men/women to teach them the first principles of Christ
- Education and LifeWork Development
  - Some will need to develop work skills
  - Need education/career guidelines, resume help





### IMPLICATIONS – MEETING PRESSING NEEDS

- Does is align with our overall church's strategies and initiatives? ReBuild? College focus?
- Does is align with our cluster gifting's, our church's gifting's or another church in our network?
- Are the leaders in my church or cluster encouraging us to participate in these things?
- Do we know of individuals in our church network that has the gifts to provide?
